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AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

CLUBS AND RECREATIONAL SPORTS FIRST TO FIFTH GRADE

As of this school year, activities from first to fifth grade will have a registration fee of \$ 100.00 per year. This payment must be made no later than August 16, 2019.

PRE-REGISTRATION DATES:

From June 14th to August 16th

- · June 18th-29th, pre-registration available on campus during the registration process.
- · June 14th-August 16th, pre-registration and change in priority available online.

PRE-REGISTRATION PROCESS:

- Each student will be able to **pre-register up to four (4) activities** by specifying the desired priority to each activity. The payment of the new fee does not guarantee that the student will be enrolled in all activities selected.
- The last day to make changes to the pre-registered activities and the assignation of priorities will be August 16 by 4:00 p.m.
- Once the pre-registration time has ended, sections per activity will be created based on the school's capacity. Each student will have a minimum of one (1) guaranteed activity.
- If the number of applications for one specific activity exceeds the school's capacity, an automatic selection process will be performed in order to determine the group of enrolled students. After all activities have been assigned, the remaining applications will be held on waiting list. Payment of the new annual fee must be made by August 16th to participate in the automatic selection of activities.
- · Changes may be made from September 9 to the 13 (subject to availability of spaces).






